The St. Aidan's Institute



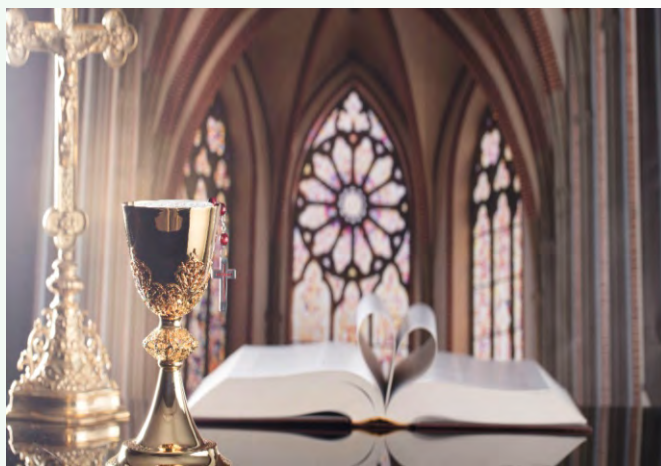
St. Aidan's Institute, is a ministry of the Anglican Union for the Propagation of the Gospel and a branch of the Center for Theological Leadership Training in the Caymen Island. We offer affordable, accredited higher-education courses in theology and theological leadership in the Anglican tradition. This happens in a unique combination of part-time residential and distance learning through study days, workshops, seminars, and conferences that promote the study of theology, ethics, philosophy, pastoral practice, spirituality, and theological reflection in dynamic ways that seek to meet and address twenty-first-century global needs and challenges.



St. Aidan's follows a Celtic model for practical evangelism and leadership (Incarnational Relational) where clergy and laity work together in an integrated model of service and education, centered in the Anglican tradition and empowered by Word, Sacrament and Spirit. (Evangelical, Catholic and Charismatic)



The St. Aidan's model enables students to remain in-place engaged in their local ministry, thus providing a practical and more sustainable model for training and educating the future lay and ordained leaders of the Church.

On-Line Courses

AS101 History of the Anglican Tradition - Part 1

The course will cover the establishment of Christian practice in the British Isles from its earliest beginning through the end of the Fifteenth Century. This includes several periods where the Church developed a character particular to its time frame (e.g. Celtic). The course will develop an understanding of the history and key persons involved in each of these periods.

AS 102 Liturgical and Sacramental Theology

This course is designed to provide an understanding of the basic development of Anglican Liturgical worship as well as a working knowledge of the liturgical practice. The course will use Common Worship from the Church of England as well as other forms. The course will explore the theology of Sacraments, especially as they relate to the liturgy.

AS103 Theology and Spirituality of the BCP

This course is designed to help students gain the competencies in critical historical and theological analysis of liturgical texts and practices so as to function effectively in a pastoral setting. It is hoped that they increase their capacity to make creative, constructive, and appropriate use of current liturgical resources in contemporary, multi-cultural, and global Anglican worship contexts as well as their own local worshipping communities.

AS104 Canons and Polity of the Anglican Communion

This course is designed to help students gain a working knowledge of the standard practices of church governance and canon law within the context of the Anglican Communion. It will explore the overall understanding of how canon law governs the administration of the church, and the Anglican Communion in particular, as well as the commonly accepted practices of church governance. It will provide students with an understanding of the authority and responsibilities of clergy operating in the Anglican Communion.

AS105 History of the Anglican Tradition - Part 2

This course is designed to help students understand how the Reformation developed within the Anglican tradition; how it depended upon the Continental Reformation and how it differed from it. It will explore themes of conflicting catholic and reformed practice within the Communion. It will also explore recent trends in the Anglican tradition, especially the Renewal movement of the 20th Century.

AS106 Anglican Pastoral Theology

This course is intended to teach pastoral ministry as it is traditionally practiced in an Anglican parish. This includes not only care for the sick, hurting, and dying members of the parish, but also other dimensions such as marriage and divorce. It seeks to apply time proven practices from the Reformed tradition as well as earlier sources.

AS107 Anglican Missiology and Evangelism

This course will explore the history and practices of Christian missions and evangelistic efforts throughout the history of the Anglican Communion. It will discuss mission societies, the relationship to colonialism and more recent developments. It will explore evangelism in both a global mission context and local context.

AS108 Celtic Spirituality and Missiology

This course will examine the practices of the Celtic Church prior to the establishment of the St. Augustine mission, with the intention to develop an understanding of how they practiced the spiritual life with the Christian faith. It will further examine how they lived out the mission of the Church and furthered the expansion of the Gospel. It will look for parallels with that context and our own for application to the current work of the Gospel.



AS109 Anglican Homiletics and Formation

This course will help the student develop preaching skills and the ability to foster Christian formation within the parish in a way that is consistent with common practices within the Anglican Communion. Preaching will be shown in the context of the lectionary and church calendar. Formation will be within the traditions of accepted Anglican theology and mindful of the needs and rhythm of the congregation.

AS110 Moral Theology

The purpose of this course is to introduce students to questions about what it means to be a moral person in our contemporary world. In particular, we will examine what it means to be a Christian moral person that is, what Christian faith and the Anglican tradition contribute to our understanding of a moral universe. We will discuss ethical principles as they have emerged throughout the Christian tradition and explore how such resources can be used to assist in discerning Christian moral life today.

Intensive Courses

AS150 Preliminaries: Anglican Union for the Propagation of the Gospel

This course is intended to provide the student with an understanding of the nature of ordained life as practiced in the Anglican Union for the Proclamation of the Gospel. It will carefully build an understanding of the sodality model and differentiate it from jurisdictional models of ecclesiastical polity. It will seek to draw a strong contrast between the self-centered approach of worldly professionalism and Christ-centered kenotic service. It will explain the roles and responsibilities of clergy operating in this organization. The course will also explain the demands of academic study relevant to the Anglican Studies program. It will teach standard academic practices consistent with graduate level work.

AS151 Practice of Liturgy

This course is designed to provide practical formation in the practice of liturgy at the parish level. It will concentrate on celebration of the Eucharist and Daily Offices, with an Anglican ethos. The course will center on a blend of Anglo-Catholic and Evangelical approaches using generally accepted norms within Anglican practice.

AS152 Shaping of Anglican Identity

This course is designed to provide an understanding of Anglican practice as it has historically emerged and where it is heading in the future. It will show how Anglican practice has integrated the historic Catholic faith from roots in the Eastern and Western Church with the Reformation to produce a reframed understanding of the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church. It will further provide an understanding of recent developments within the Anglican Communion world-wide. This information will be used to help understand emerging trends in the Church and gain insight into likely future developments for the Anglican Communion.

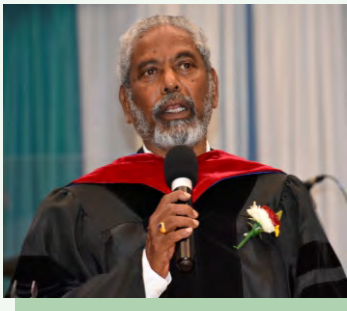
